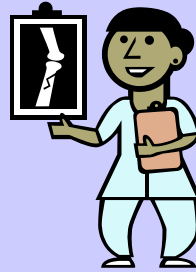
TOM HEGARTY

PRO TIP – PLAYING IN THE COLD.

Here is a few cold-weather tips to help you play well and enjoy your round even if there's a snap in the air.

Warm up and stretch longer.

Our bodies are stiffer and more prone to injury when it's colder. In addition to your usual arm and back rotations, try some knee bends, and before teeing off, get your blood flowing by taking a few extra free-wheeling practice swings with your driver.

Wear thin layers of clothing.

Not only do they allow you to move more freely while keeping warm, layering also allows you to remove clothing piece by piece as you play and the day warms up.

Consider a beanie & gloves.

Keeping your head and hands warm are the key; heat loss is greatest from your head, and your hands need to be warm to grip the club properly. If it gets real cold, or you suffer from joint pain, bring wool gloves to wear between shots.

Take extra club and swing freely.

Just like they say "When it's breezy, swing easy," the same is true for cold weather. Fight the natural tendency to swing harder, which increases the chance for errors.

Nip shots cleaner, play ball a little back.

Putting the ball back in your stance a tad will promote a cleaner hit. Divots from a downward swing can be harder to take because the ground is cold and hard, so swing on a flatter plane.

Keep balls inside overnight.

Cold golf balls do not compress as much or fly as far as a warmer ball. Since it takes about 10 hours for the colder temps to infiltrate the core of a ball, keep the balls you'll play with indoors prior to your round and you should see little or no effect due to the ball during a four- or even five-hour round. But balls left in the car or garage overnight will indeed see reduced distance due to a cold core.

Wear waterproof shoes.

Wet feet are a bummer when it's cold, so make sure your shoes can stand up to melting dew that is certain to appear after a cold night.

A hot drink never hurt.

Whether it's a coffee, hot chocolate, tea or even an Irish coffee, a cup of a hot drink will keep your innards warm while you navigate the course.
